"Be Healed Part II"

1. What exactly am I talking about when I talk about healing?

Healing is the process of being made whole: body soul and spirit. It includes:

- the restoration of our communion with God,
- our own integration,
- and reconciliation with those around us.

You could kind of think of it this way God creates us in his image and likeness, that is were made like him for love and life and community:

- To be in a relationship with Him to be in a relationship
- There's a way in which we are in relationship with ourselves, properly ordered, we have self-control, we can be chaste, we have integrity we are what we want to be.
- With other people as well

2. Wounds that destroy our wholeness and happiness

Satan attacks and wounds - specifically he tries to destroy that part of us which loves and is capable of receiving love:

- 1. Often those wounds are the result of other people's sinfulness.
- 2. Often our wounds are self-inflicted from our own sinful choices, our bad habits, and the compromises we make with them.
- 3. And some wounds we carry aren't really anyone's fault.
- Ultimately, most of the wounds we experience in life lead us to a case of mistaken identity.
- Again, our true identity is beloved son of God, beloved daughter of God but all that
 traumatic and awful stuff that happens makes it hard to believe or understand that identity
 and instead we end up with confusion and a deep sense, even an identity, of being unloved
 or unlovable and abandoned.
