Year A 7tth Sunday Homily Outline

Jesus invites us beyond the minimalist rule-follower mentality to a real change of heart and transformation of our lives.

Daydream of heaven

1. The Gospel makes clear that Jesus isn't interested in us doing the minimum

You have heard that it was said ... But I say to you...

In each of these YOU HAVE HEARD THAT IT WAS SAID – BUT I SAY TO YOU statements there is an invitation to go beyond a minimalist approach to the Christian life and to journey down to the heart of the matter. And invitation to go beyond superficially following the rules – to a real transformation of heart.

2. Desire for a real and complete transformation of the heart

- We want something better than just enough self-discipline, enough willpower
 or to be able to keep myself from getting filled with rage and anger.
- We want something deeper than just enough self-control to keep from falling into sins of lust.
- We want something better than just enough self-mastery to not blatantly lie or seek revenge.

We don't want to be this barely controlled bundle of wickedness where outwardly we live as Christians, but inwardly we are seething and simmering with temptation and sin.

3. How do we get there?

In my experience the Lord works to transform us little by little – it is just the daily work and effort put into knowing Jesus, loving Jesus, and following Jesus.

Lent gives us a good opportunity to restart this journey again — if we find that we've stalled out somewhere.

This year as well, at Star – we have been working on a few other things for all of us – to make ourselves available for that same encounter with Jesus that changes us and gives us light and life.
